# **Highlights Of The LWML North Dakota District Convention**







On June 14-16, 2024, we joyfully gathered together as sisters and brothers in Christ for the 41st biennial LWML North Dakota District Convention in Bismarck. The theme of this convention was "Lord of All Creation" based on Colossians 1:16.

Messiah Lutheran Church welcomed the Board of Directors for the pre-convention board meeting, while convention attendees gathered at Bethel Lutheran Church for packing Mercy Meals, choir practice, fellowship served by the women of Zion Lutheran Church, and joined in the Divine Service with holy communion to open the convention on Friday. The YWRs worked with volunteers from Holy Cross to collect and pack Gifts from the Heart to be donated to Holy Cross — Friends in Mission and Martin Luther School.

On Saturday and Sunday, the convention events were held at the Ramada Hotel where we were inspired, uplifted, and encouraged in our faith with Bible study led by Rev. Chris Waldvogel, our Senior Pastoral Counselor; mission speakers, Rev. Steve Schulz of Mission Central and Rev. Max Phillips of Lutheran Family Service; keynote speaker Rev. Dr. Adam Filipek, Pastor of Holy Cross and Immanuel Lutheran Churches in Lidgerwood, ND and author of "Life in Christ — Rooted, Woven, and Grafted into God's Story"; raised our voices in song led by Tom & Quincy Wyatt of Messiah Lutheran; and were greeted by LWML President Eden Keefe as she shared a message from the National LWML. President LaurieAnn Totenhagen presided over the convention and led delegates in voting for the 2024-2026 LWML ND DIstrict Mite Goal of \$78,000, mission grants, changes to the by-laws, and new officers to serve the LWML North Dakota District. We were entertained by the River Rhapsody Chorus — a local chapter of the Sweet Adelines singing four-part harmony in a cappella after the banquet meal on Saturday evening at the Ramada. Participants were able to visit the exhibit hall complete with the LWML Store featuring some new items and a limited selection of books from CPH. Rev. Chris Waldvogel led the closing worship on Sunday morning along with the installation of the new officers. We praise God and pray for wisdom and guidance for each of the women who were elected to serve in a position for the LWML.

# Final Tally Of Ingathering Items by Brianna Wegner, VP Human Care

During the 2024 LWML North Dakota District Convention, <u>851</u> school supplies were donated for Martin Luther School in Bismarck, ND to assist teachers in their classrooms. <u>2,378</u> Items ranging from skeins of yarn and spools of thread to winter hats, gloves, scarves and other crocheted items were donated for Holy Cross Friends in Mission to be given to those in need in the Bismarck-Mandan community. The yarn and thread will be used by the Holy Cross Friends in Mission to create warm hats, gloves, scarves and the like to be distributed to those in need in the community. <u>6,048</u> Mercy Meals were packed to be sent down to towns along the Texas/Mexico border or overseas to Liberia. Thank you every one who assisted with packing meals and gathering items!

# **Bylaw Changes Approved By 2024 LWML ND District Convention**

ARTICLE XV — MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

AMENDMENT: In Section 1 a. delete "in resolution form"

#### Adopted amendment:

Section 1a

Mission grant proposals shall be submitted to the LWML ND District Vice President of Mission Grants at least six (6) months prior to the LWML ND District Convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML individuals, groups, units, zones, or LCMS Boards.

#### ARTICLE XVI — FISCAL YEAR.

AMENDMENT: In article name, strike "YEAR" and insert "BIENNIUM".

Adopted amendment:

Article Xvi - Fiscal Biennium

#### ARTICLE XVI — FISCAL YEAR

AMENDMENT: Strike "year" and insert "biennium"; and strike "March 1 to the last day of February inclusive" and insert "July 1 to June 30".

#### Adopted amendment:

#### ARTICLE XVI - FISCAL BIENNIUM

The fiscal biennium of the LWML ND District shall be from July 1 to June 30. The LWML ND District Financial Secretary and LWML ND District Treasurer shall close the books on the last day of June.

# A Message From Jr. Pastoral Counselor, Rev. Daniel Suelzle



I've spent many early Sunday mornings this summer driving to various congregations as I've been filling in for pastors. I've admired many fields of wheat, corn, beans, and canola during my hours in the car, and as the summer weeks wear on, of course the plants get taller and riper. In a handful of weeks, the fields will be ready for harvest, after which they will be prepared to lay fallow until the next spring when the rhythm will start all over.

This rhythm is nothing new; it's something that we all know about. But perhaps we don't often pause to consider how instructive it is. To put a bunch of seeds into the earth is, in one sense, a profound act of faith. Sure, we can nourish them and water them; fertilize them and tend them. But ultimately we can take zero credit for the fact that a seed, as Jesus says in his parable, grows into "the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear" (Mark 4:28). We wouldn't plant the seed except that we trust that it will grow into something fruitful; we trust that the seed will do what God created it to do.

What a beautiful — and humbling — parable that our Lord teaches us. So often we are tempted to think that we must have control over God's Word. Sometimes we are even tempted to want to take credit for any fruit that God's Word produces. But this parable reminds us that it is not we who bring the growth; it is the Lord. We sow the seed, and he makes it grow. When we sow the seed of the Word; when we proclaim Law and Gospel; when we share the good news that Christ has died and risen for the forgiveness of the world's sin, we are privileged to be the mouthpiece of the Word that is living, active, and able to make its hearers wise unto salvation. The Lord promises to make the seed grow according to his good pleasure, to accomplish his holy purposes. And yes, sometimes that means that it is not for us to see the results.

But make no mistake. The day of harvest will eventually come. At the Lord's return we will rejoice with all the saints in glory at the sight of all of the fruit of the Word of Christ, as we stand among the countless host praising God for all of eternity. In the meantime, we are encouraged simply and faithfully to sow the seed of the Gospel, trusting that it will do what God has given it to do. May the Lord always give you courage and comfort to do this with your family and friends, as you share with them the love of Christ, which he has shown in his death and resurrection for us all!
